

<u>Call for applications: 4th Regional Workshop for Europe on</u> <u>Visitor Centres in UNESCO Designated Sites (Deadline: 16</u> <u>September 2022)</u>

UNESCO invites professionals from visitor/interpretation/information centres of UNESCO World Heritage Sites in Europe to apply to participate in the 4th Regional Workshop on the role of Visitor Centres in UNESCO Designated Sites. The Workshop, tentatively scheduled for 7th - 9th November 2022 in Buzău, Romania, will focus on tourism sustainability and visitor management.

accessibility, fostering community engagement, supporting visitor management, influencing behaviours during visits and collecting data on visitors, their needs, expectations and site experience.

The upcoming workshop is organised within the framework of the regional initiative on <u>"The role of Visitor Centres in UNESCO Designated Sites"</u> launched by the UNESCO Regional Bureau for Science and Culture in Europe in 2018. The initiative aims to investigate how visitor/interpretation/information centres dedicated to World Heritage properties can contribute to the broader goals of the designations and of the sites themselves.

The definition of "Visitor Centre" within the present framework refers to any kind of organised service with front-desk activities, the main purpose of which is to welcome and orient visitors, facilitate the visit, and enhance the presentation and interpretation of UNESCO designated sites. This concept includes a broad range of different structures, sometimes carrying different names such as "interpretation centre", "information centre", "house", site's "house" or "museum", among others.

Participation costs

Participation in the workshop is free of charge. Selected applicants will receive accommodation (boarding and lodging) in Buzău for the duration of the workshop.

Applicants may request support for their travel costs, which will be provided in the form of pre-paid tickets, contingent on the availability of funds. Priority in the provision of the travel support will be given to eligible applicants from the countries under the geographical scope of the UNESCO Regional Bureau for Science and Culture in Europe.

How to apply

Please fill out and submit the <u>online application</u> form **by no later than 16 September 2022.**

In addition, applicants who did not participate in previous activities organised by this Regional Bureau are advised to send a **letter of support** by the respective visitor centre or site managing authority and an **updated CV** to Zhi Ye (<u>z.ye@unesco.org</u>) within the above-mentioned deadline.
