

## New Lanark 2022: A Living Legacy

New Lanark: A Living Legacy From Robert Owen to World Heritage and Beyond

A celebration of the legacies of social reform, heritage-led regeneration and World Heritage 01 to 03 March 2022

During 2021, <u>New Lanark World Heritage Site</u> marked three important milestones:

- The 250<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the birth of Robert Owen, the site's most famous advocate
- The 20<sup>th</sup> anniversary of UNESCO World Heritage Site inscription
- The completion of the restoration of the former millworkers' housing in the village

Owen's extensive legacy, how this tangible and intangible legacy has been preserved, and how Owen's influence, shaping other places, helped justify New Lanark's 'Outstanding Universal Value'. New Lanark was recognised by the UNESCO World Heritage Committee in 2001 along with two properties in England that developed communities around factories: Derwent Valley Mills and Saltaire.

Running from **1-3 March 2022**, the conference will reflect on the relevance of these topics today, exploring how sites address UNESCO's Sustainable Development Goals, the value of culture and heritage to our wellbeing, industrial democracy, workers' rights and co-operation. Also being explored and celebrated will be the cross sector partnerships which have enabled the site to develop, and in particular the hundreds of people who have supported its regeneration.
