# New report uncovers impact of COVID-19 crisis on heritage

A new report evaluates how heritage organisations across the UK used the emergency funding which the National Lottery Heritage Fund provided last year. The Heritage Emergency Fund, set up within weeks of the start of the crisis, saw £49,829,600 awarded to 961 organisations across the UK. Grants were awarded to keep organisations afloat and help with reopening across the breadth of heritage. This report provides valuable insight into how heritage was affected by the crisis and the challenges they still face.

### World Heritage to benefit from Darwin grant

Marking World Environment Day 2021, over £8 million of new funding to protect rare wildlife and vulnerable habitats in UK Overseas Territories across the globe has been announced by the <u>UK Government</u>. This will include support for a partnership project to restore Gough Island, a threatened UK World Heritage Site in the Tristan da Cunha group of islands in the South Atlantic, recognised as one of the most important seabird islands in the world.

The extended 44th session of the World Heritage Committee is organized at Fuzhou by UNESCO in cooperation with the Host Country, the People's Republic of China, 16th-31st July 2021.
