

Developing New Audiences for World Heritage Sites

Are you interested in attracting new and more diverse audiences to your archaeology or heritage project/organisation? Have you ever had an idea for an inclusive engagement project but not had the time, ability or confidence to plan it properly? Then this new programme might be for you...

[Wessex Archaeology](#), [York Archaeology](#) and [MOLA](#) (Museum of London Archaeology) have joined forces to offer an **8-part online mentoring scheme** starting in October 2022. Their three-month digital programme is for anyone involved in archaeology or heritage who wants to **work with new audiences** but isn't sure where to start.

Their mentors will take you, step-by-step, through the project-development process, helping you to transform your engagement project from an initial idea to a fully-fledged, grant-ready proposal.

The deadline for applications is midnight on Sunday the 2nd of October.

This scheme is part of the [Archaeological Audience Network](#) (AAN), a strategic collaboration between some of the largest and most innovative archaeological organisations in the UK. Funded by the Department for Digital, Culture, Media and Sport (DCMS) and the National Lottery Heritage Fund's Digital Skills for Heritage Initiative, the AAN is building a community of practice to aggregate, learn from and improve how audience data can be used to achieve more meaningful impacts. 
