The World Heritage Cities Programme is one of six thematic programmes formally approved and monitored by the World Heritage Committee. The programme assists States Parties in the challenges of protecting and managing their urban heritage and integrating with sustainable urban development. The programme includes communication and exchange across more than 300 World Heritage cities, the development of guidance and good practices around urban heritage conservation. Using the 2011 UNESCO Recommendation on the Historic Urban Landscape as a tool, the programme focuses on innovative solutions and strategies and building capacities through collaboration and collearning.

The UNESCO Recommendation on the Historic Urban Landscape (HUL Recommendation) was adopted by the 36th Session of the UNESCO General Conference in 2011, and it presents an innovative integrated approach to urban conservation.

- Developing graphic materials, such as, drawings, catalogues, banners, posters, maps and diagrams related to the diverse activities of the World Heritage Cities Programme.

SELECTION CRITERIA

Students currently pursuing post-graduate studies or enrolled in a professional training programme; or recent graduates (within one year of completing post-graduate studies).

Education: Architecture, Urban planning/design, urban geography, heritage conservation, cultural policy, international relations, and public policies related to cultural fields. Overall knowledge of UNESCO World Heritage Convention and the HUL Recommendation and/ or UNESCO Culture Conventions is required.

Languages: Excellent research and writing skills in English and/or French and good knowledge of the other language. Good knowledge of Spanish would be an asset.

Skills and competencies:

- Good knowledge of UNESCO's World Heritage Convention
- Good analytical and communication skills
- Good IT skills, including good knowledge of design software (InDesign, Photoshop or similar); and Geographic Information Systems (ArcGIS Pro, ArcGIS online, QGIS)
