The Mayor of Bath's Honorary Guides will lead 50-minute guided tours to see the landscape setting, celebrating Bath's amazing scenery. Setting out from the Guildhall, the tours start at 11.30am, leave regularly and the last tour will be at 2.30pm. Included is a visit to the Abbey plant room, normally closed to the public, to explore its innovative new eco-heating system, powered by the hot waste water from the Hot Spring. Join a tour on arrival or sign-up for a later slot at the Guides' stand in the Banqueting Room. Suitable for all ages.

Explore World Heritage Day 2024 along the Great West Way

Celebrate World Heritage Day this April with a tour of the <u>Great West Way</u>'s breath-taking World Heritage Sites. Between London and Bristol, you will find some of the most famous landmarks and destinations. The Great West Way is a touring route based on ancient routes, following 500 miles of navigable routes, roaming through idyllic countryside, quaint villages and elegant towns.

To the west is the <u>City of Bath</u>; to the east <u>Blenheim Palace</u>.

In-between lies <u>Stonehenge and Avebury WHS</u>. Centrally located along the Great West Way and possibly one of the most famous landmarks to visit on the route.

Stonehenge - Managed by English Heritage, <u>Stonehenge</u> dates back to around 5,000 years and continues to elude many visitors around its mystery and breath-taking display each year. Evolving between 3,000 and 1,600 BC, this prehistoric monument famously aligns with the rising and setting of the sun at both Summer and Winter Solstices.

before opening to the general public, this intimate experience allows you to walk amongst the stones within a small group.

Avebury - 40 minutes from Stonehenge is the other half of the UNESCO World Heritage Site and the largest stone circle in the world. <u>Avebury</u> was erected 4,500 years ago and consists of around 100 stones, now framing the small town. The site is open daily, and visitors are welcome to walk amongst the stones, as well as explore ancient tombs, avenues and surrounding sights including the West Kennet Long Barrow and Silbury Hill.

Learn more about Avebury's prehistoric past within two galleries at the <u>Alexander Keiller Museum</u>. The 17th Century Barn Gallery houses interactive displays, and the Stables Gallery provides a collection of archaeological finds.
