# ICOMOS-UK's Summer Hybrid Event - Upland farming communities as deliverers of cultural and natural heritage

Join <u>ICOMOS-UK</u> on **Tuesday 16th July 2024**, 4.30pm – 6.30pm (with a reception afterwards 6.30pm – 8pm) to hear about the <u>Dartmoor Review</u> and how local communities should have a stronger voice in managing cultural landscapes.

Dartmoor together with other English National Parks and the English Lake District World Heritage Site are much loved protected landscapes, shaped by generations of pastoralists. Following the recent independent **Dartmoor Review,** commissioned by the government, the need for farmers' voices to be heard in the management of these upland cultural landscapes has come strongly into focus.

ICOMOS-UK's Summer Event is both in-person (at 70 Cowcross Street, London EC1M) and online, and gives delegates the chance to hear about the

management of our protected landscapes and in the delivery of their cultural as well as natural heritage benefits.
