With a proactive approach and ability to facilitate discussions you will work with partners across the Council as well as across the Orkney Community

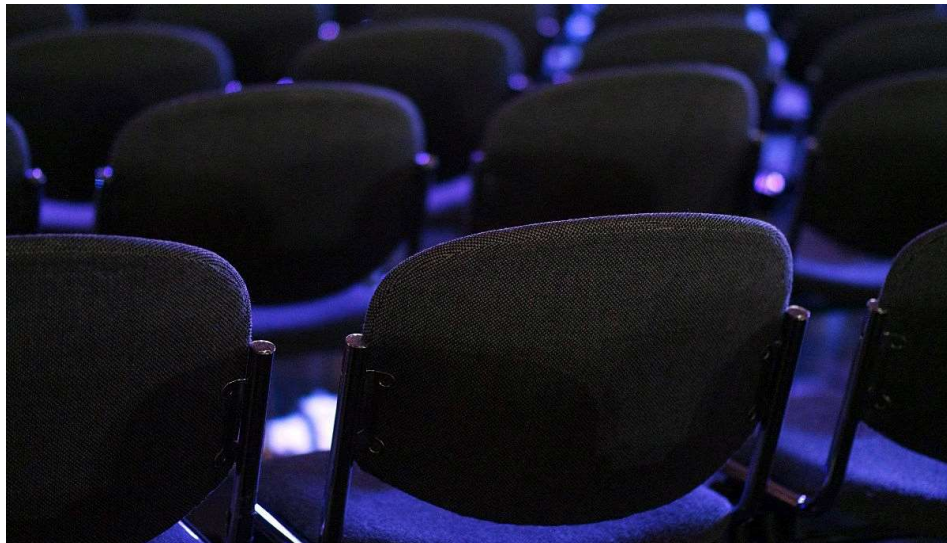
