## **UNESCO UK Audience Development & Mapping Toolkit**

The <u>UK National Commission for UNESCO</u> (UKNC) and The Audience Agency are launching this toolkit at a free online event.

With support from the National Lottery Heritage Fund, the toolkit is an industry first and has been co-developed with the UK's network of UNESCO-designated sites, which include Biosphere Reserves, Creative Cities, Global Geoparks and World Heritage Sites.

Cultural and natural heritage should be important for everybody. There is global precedence for increasing connection and engagement across and between communities. The UN's 2030 Agenda hinges on strong connections and partnerships – with the central promise to 'leave no one behind' and the 2024 UN Pact for the Future further asserts the need for a whole of society approach,

community, to enjoy the arts and to share in scientific advancement and its benefits."

At this free online event, UKNC and The Audience Agency will introduce the new toolkit, share some case studies for its use, and provide an opportunity for questions and discussion.
