Tickets for this webinar are £5. A series ticket for all 4 webinars is £15.


We've already heard from Canterbury Cathedral, Westminster Abbey and Durham Cathedral.

## ICOMOS-UK's Christmas Lecture - Waking Sleeping Giants: The Painted Hall, Greenwich; Dockyard Church, Sheerness; and the North Wing at St Bartholomew's Hospital

In this year's ICOMOS-UK Christmas lecture, Will Palin, former Conservation Director at the Old Royal Naval College, will discuss the challenges and successes of three major building conservation projects he has overseen since 2016. He will recount the story behind the epic Painted Hall project (completed in 2019); the rescue of the fire-ravaged Dockyard Church in Sheerness (completed last year); and give an update on his ongoing £10m project at St Bartholomew's Hospital in the City of London, due to finish in the summer of 2025.

You will also have an opportunity to hear about the history of St Alfege, designed by Hawksmoor, and the ongoing work to open up the heritage of this building to new communities.
