This year's WHUK Annual Conference will be held in Saltaire WHS, on Thursday 9th & Friday 10th October.



### World Heritage Webinars - Europe

The next series of webinars will introduce the **European Network of World Heritage Associations** (ENWHA) and focus on a handful of their Sites from across Europe. The series will comprise 5 webinars.

World Heritage UK is a member of the ENWHA which is a union of associations and initiatives that regularly exchange information and experience about the World Heritage. The aim is to raise general awareness of European World Heritage, to advocate its protection and conservation, and to discuss common issues and topics using an open and transparent approach.

WHUK hopes this series will be the first of many highlighting WHSs from across the ENWHA membership and will allow attendees the opportunity to discover World Heritage outside of the UK.

Each webinar is recorded and uploaded to WHUK's private YouTube channel. All ticket holders will be sent a link to the video, to revisit or catch up if the live talk was missed. Series ticket holders will have access to all five videos.
